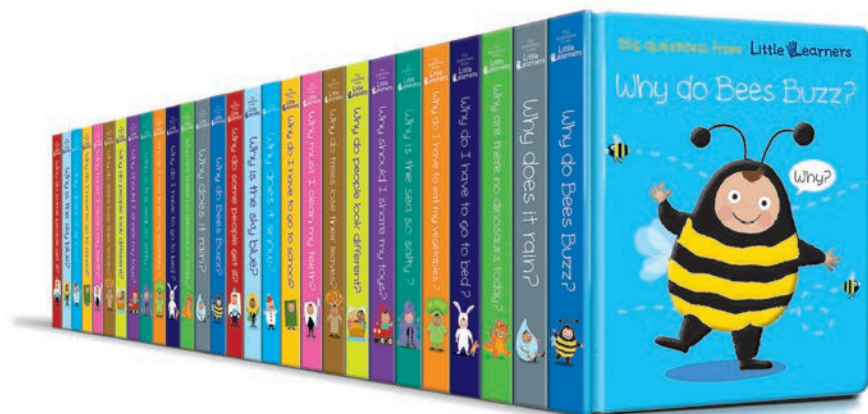






Big questions from Little Learners

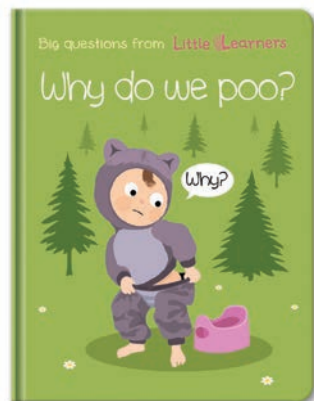
Starting school is the first step into a world of exciting, new experiences.

An introduction to the functioning of the human body. Follow the journey of food through the alimentary canal and understand how food is processed to create energy and healthy growth.

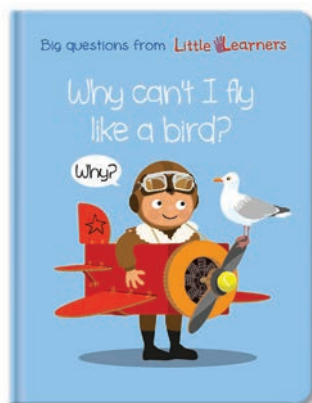
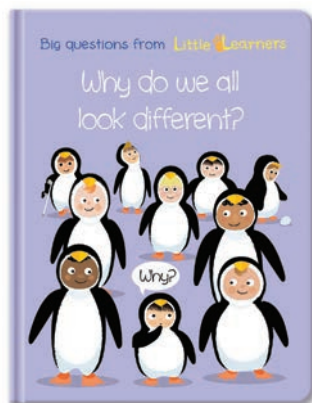

TAKE A CLOSER LOOK

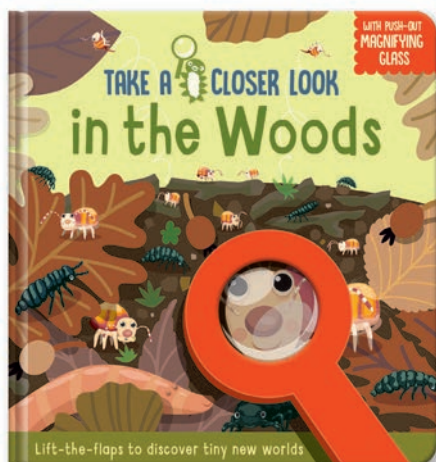


Some creatures can be easy to spot. Whilst others require the observer to wait quietly for hours or even days before they are seen.

But there is another world to discover that is bustling with strange looking 'minibeasts'. These tiny creatures go about their daily lives whilst being largely ignored by most of us, yet they are nearly everywhere: In the town, in the country, even living with us in our homes.

This book with its push-out magnifying glass, will introduce curious children to this fascinating, easily accessible, miniature world.

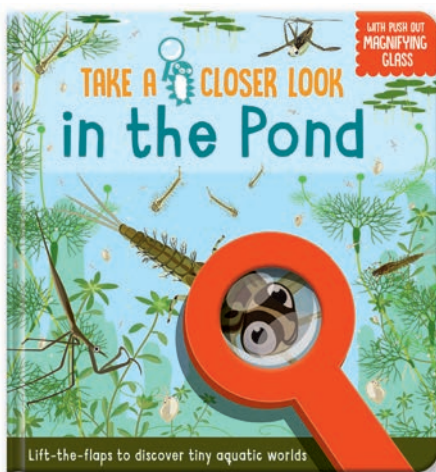
All they have to do is take a closer look.



Inside this book there are things to spot using the press-out magnifying glass: Tiny speech bubbles of text to read, and things to count like numbers of legs etc. Lift a leaf to discover more creatures underneath and a peep hole that partially reveals a new encounter waiting on the next page.



Take a journey under the surface of a freshwater pond without having to go near a real one. Lift curtains of weed and look under stones to reveal ever smaller aquatic 'mini-beasts'. Use the magnifying glass to see what they might be saying to each other.
