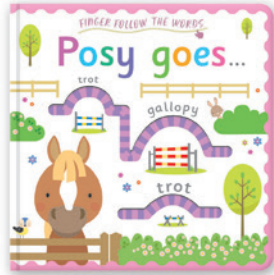
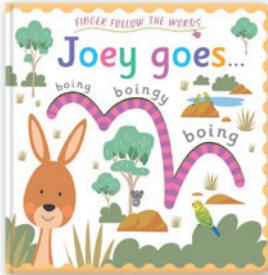
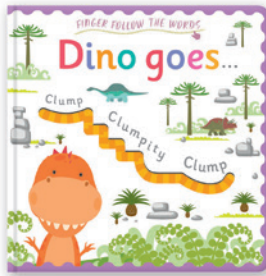


Trace the embedded word trail in each scene to find out where the cute characters go. Children will love calling out the words as their finger passes under them, guided by the groove cut onto page.

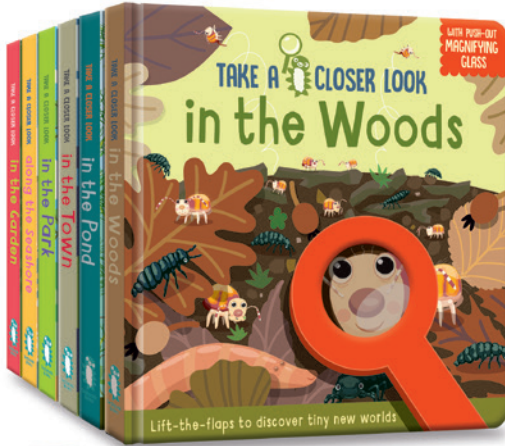

Inspiring young minds to engage with the natural world.

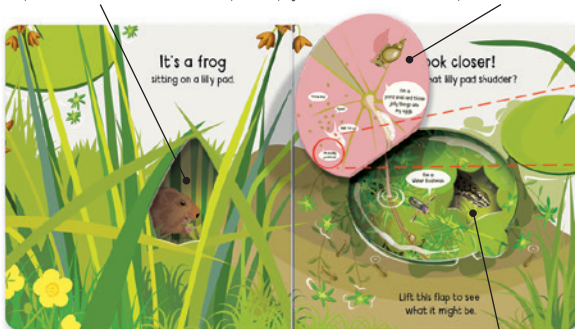


Thousands upon thousands of tiny creatures go about their daily lives whilst being largely ignored by most of us, yet they are nearly everywhere: In the town, in the country, even living with us in our homes. These books with their push-out lenticular magnifying glass, will introduce curious children to this fascinating, easily accessible, miniature world. All they have to do is take a closer look.

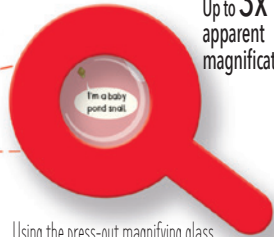
Example spread from In the Pond.

Lift the flap to discover a new smaller creatures.



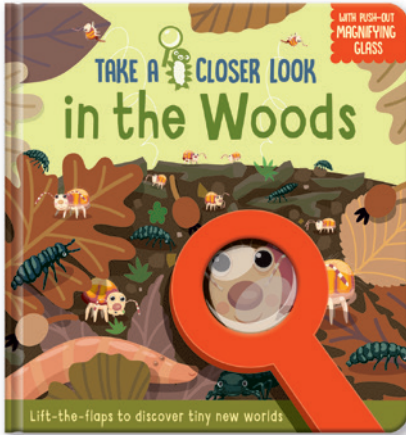

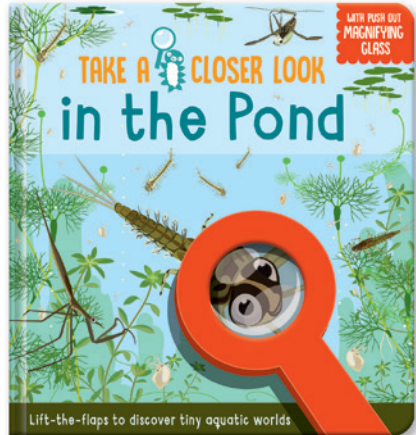
Using the press-out magnifying glass you can see what the tiny creatures in the book are saying to each other.

TAKE A CLOSER LOOK



Inside this book there are things to spot using the press-out magnifying glass. Take a page-by-page journey, down into the micro world beneath our feet. From a warty toad under a log, to swarms of minute springtails somersaulting amongst the particles of leaf litter.



Take a journey under the surface of a freshwater pond. Lift curtains of weed and look under stones to reveal ever smaller aquatic 'mini-beasts'. Use the magnifying glass to see what they might be saying to each other. Can you see how many waterboatman are hiding on a page.



This book takes the reader on an imagined trip to the seaside. Discover the tiny creatures lurking in the sand, the tide line, and the rockpools. Turn over the layers of salty seaweed and see how much life dwells in this ever-changing, natural environment.



Next time you are walking through your local town park, take a closer look at the plants and trees. What's that hiding under that leaf? What are those tiny things clustering around the rose buds? This interactive book will help young nature detectives to identify urban mini beasts.
